APPEALS PROCEDURES

If you, a representative, or your attending physician chooses to appeal a decision to deny payment for services, the appeal may be submitted by calling us at (800) 528-5763 or mailed to the address listed below:

You have a right to have a representative act on your behalf. All appeals should be directed to the attention of the Appeals Coordinator. You have a right to submit written comments, documents or other information relevant to the appeal. New Directions reviews all appeal requests and all previous letters, denials and medical records.

You may request an immediate appeal to an independent review organization if you have a life-threatening condition.

If you are currently in the hospital, you, or your attending physician may request an expedited appeal. An expedited appeal will be resolved within the timeframes defined by your benefit plan or applicable regulations.

You have the right to an independent review of this decision at no cost to you if you have exhausted the appeal rights available under your health plan.

Upon receipt of an appeal request, New Directions Behavioral Health will:

- Acknowledge receipt of your request for an appeal.
- Document the substance of your appeal and action taken.
- Investigate the substance of the appeal, including any clinical issues involved.
- Have a person or people not involved in the prior adverse decision review this appeal.
- Send you a letter explaining the resolution of the appeal and the basis for the decision within the timeframes defined by your benefit plan or applicable regulations.
- Advise you of your right to seek review of the denial by an independent review organization, and the procedures and form for obtaining that review.

If your claim was denied because of a benefit that is not covered by your health plan, your appeal will not be reviewed for medical necessity at any level of appeal regardless of your health condition. An appeal for benefits not covered in your health plan will be carefully reviewed to verify that your claim was processed correctly according to the terms of your health plan.
