Alcohol Use Disorder (AUD) has three FDA-approved medications:

Revia and Campral Antabuse Vivitrol, Embeda acamprosate disulfiram

Not all prescribers offer all MAT medications. It is important to determine which MAT medication may be indicated in order to match the consumer with a provider who has the capability to assist the member.

Clinical decisions regarding the most appropriate medications are made by the prescribing provider. New Directions makes referrals for assessments to allow for this clinical/prescriber recommendation.

MAT Medication Pharmacy Benefit Coverage

Consumers, consumer representatives or providers may ask questions about pharmacy benefit coverage for MAT medications. New Directions does not manage pharmacy benefit coverage for MAT medication so is unable to provide cost or coverage information.

The costs of medications vary depending on the health plan sponsor/customer, medication and pharmacy formulary. Pharmacy benefits are subject to change and are best accessed directly through the Pharmacy Benefit Manager (PBM).
